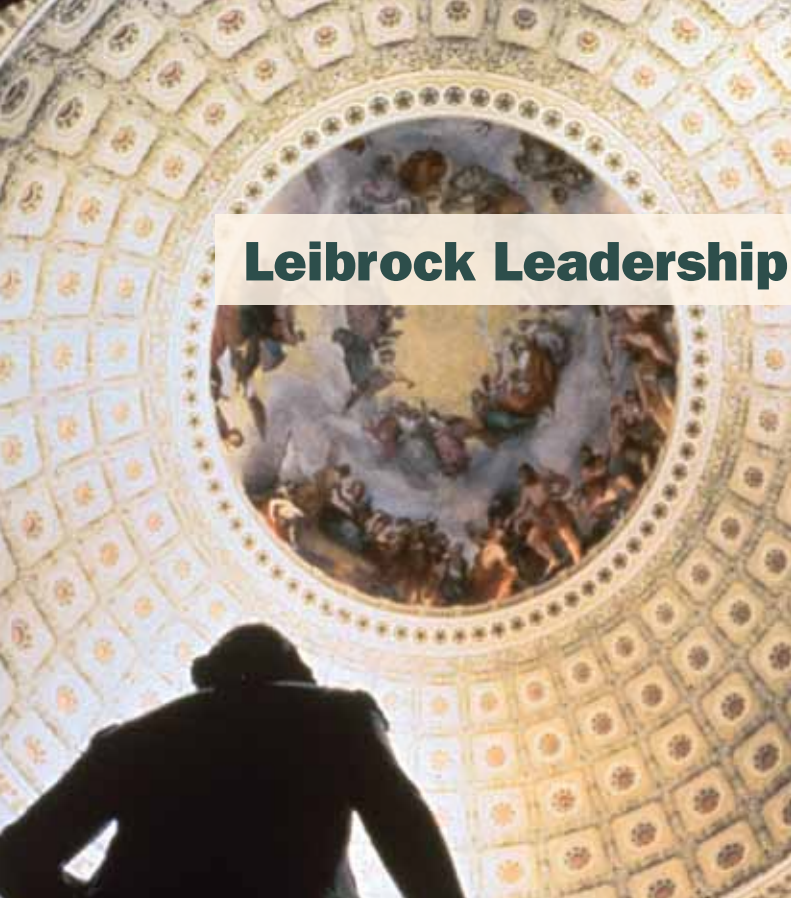




Leibrock Leadership Development Course (LLDC)
